What is safeguarding?

Safeguarding is about the **prevention and protection of others....**

"Safeguarding means preventing and protecting children and adults at risk from abuse or neglect and educating those around them to recognise the signs and dangers". (Source – Wales Safeguarding procedures).

Safeguarding in Sport

Safeguarding in sport means protecting children and young people from abuse, preventing harm and promoting their wellbeing.

For sports clubs this means having:

- Effective safeguarding policies and procedures
- Codes of conduct for sport
- Safe recruitment processes
- Relevant training for staff and volunteers

Safeguarding in Archery

Archery GB says:

"We are committed to creating and maintaining a safe and positive environment for everyone involved in archery. It is our shared responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children, young people and adults at risk and protect them from poor practice, abuse, grooming and bullying. Working with the NSPCC Child Protection in Sport Unit (CPSU) Archery GB has developed policies, procedures and guidelines to support everyone in our sport".

Safeguarding at Llantarnam Archery Club

Llantarnam Archery Club (archers, coaches, committee members and associate members) have a duty to follow national guidance on safeguarding and also the guidance set out by Archery GB.

There is a phrase – SAFEGUARDING IS EVERONE'S BUSINESS (or RESPONSIBILITY)

This means - if you suspect someone at the club is at risk from abuse or neglect then *you* have a duty to report your concern.



If you know the club member very well and feel confident enough to do so, you could approach him/her/them and sensitively explore your concerns. If the situation is too challenging to be resolved - concerns can be communicated to the Welfare Officer or a member of the committee.
